


From what I can find out it is a reedited version from 1970's of an earlier version in 1910-1920's.

I wonder who the couple are on the verandah? Could it be an earlier photo of George and Janet together or is it Mr and Mrs O'Connor?



This is the site in 2017.






Definitely George Wallace on the wall above the door.



Look at all the photos just sitting there. Wonder where they have ended up? Photo below from Pop's collection. The figurines on the top shelves above mantle are the same.






Above, Copy of ad from 1932 for auction of personal items. Advert below describes the property and grounds in detail.
